Parent Instructions:

This resource aims to allow children to practice their fluency in order to meet the expected standard. Each 60-Second Read Activity Card features a short extract of age-appropriate text with an average word count of 90 words. The cumulative word count for each line of text is shown in the left-hand margin of each card. Each of the cards also contains a set of comprehension questions that link to the KS1 reading content domains. Each different question type has its own canine helper to remind children of what they need to do to answer a question appropriately.

Vocabulary Questions with Vocabulary Victor

Vocabulary Victor will help you to look at how authors and poets have chosen to use certain words and phrases.

1a: Draw on knowledge of vocabulary to understand texts.



Retrieval Questions with Rex Retriever

Rex Retriever will help you to go into a text and retrieve the facts.

1b: Identify/explain key aspects of fiction and non-fiction texts, such as characters, events, titles and information.



Sequence Questions with Sequencing Suki

Sequencing Suki likes everything in order! She will help you to sequence the events in a text.

1c: Identify and explain the sequence of events in texts.



Inference Questions with Inference Iggy

Inference Iggy will help you to hunt for clues in a text about how someone might be feeling or why something is happening.

1d: Make inferences from the text.



Prediction Questions with Predicting Pip

Predicting Pip tries to see the future and she will help you to work out what might happen next.

1e: Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far.

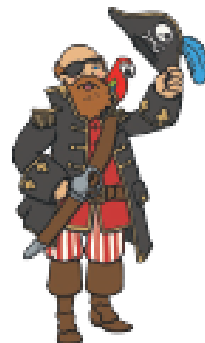

How to Make Fairy Cakes

1 Ingredients

- 4 • 100g self-raising flour
- 6 • 100g sugar
- 8 • 100g butter
- 10 • two eggs
- 12 • icing sugar
- 13 • sprinkles



14 Method

- 24 1. Turn the oven on at 180°C or gas mark 4.
- 31 2. Mix the sugar and the butter together.
- 44 3. Sieve the flour gently into the bowl and fold it into the mixture.
- 53 4. Whisk the eggs and stir them into the mixture.
- 66 5. Divide the cake mixture evenly between 12 cake cases in a baking tray.
- 82 6. Ask a grown-up to help you to put the cakes into the oven for 20 minutes.
- 95 7. Take the cakes out of the oven and wait for them to cool.
- 105 8. Decorate your cakes with icing sugar and your favourite sprinkles.
